Penola Senior Student Leaders' Camp

For our College community, Mary MacKillop is the key figure that we look up to, as she and Father Julian Tenison Woods established the first Catholic schools in South Australia. We are grateful for their example, and during our Senior Leaders' Camp, we deepened our understanding of these role models, and reflected on how we can take those examples into our leadership this year.

The Senior Leaders (Year 12 Leaders, House Captains and Year 11 Leaders), spent three fun and thoughtful days together in Penola learning about the Josephite tradition. It was amazing to actually walk in the footsteps of Mary MacKillop, seeing the area where she and Father Tenison Woods started the first school in an old stable. We also visited the Naracoorte Caves, retracing the footsteps of Father Tenison Woods, learning so much more about his work as a scientist and artist.

This Leadership camp was very beneficial to us in many ways: we

were fortunate enough to visit Mary MacKillop Memorial Primary School in Penola. There we put our leadership skills into actions, devising and running a liturgy with the Year 4/5 classes, and later, running a number of group bonding activities. Not only was this fun, but as a group of leaders, we learned how to better operate as a team. On the last day, we took time to plan for initiatives at our College this year, and we also wrote letters to future selves, setting goals to achieve by the end of the year.

Our overarching theme, that we decided upon at the camp, was inspired by Mary MacKillop's saying "Find happiness in making others happy". Premier's Reading Challenge





Premiers Reading Challenge is up and away for 2023 and we are celebrating its 20th year running. This is for all students from R to12. Why not get recognition for books you are already reading in English. You can get anything from a certificate to medals. Application/ Student Reading Records are available from the Resource Centre/Library.

What is the Challenge?

The Premier's Reading Challenge is a literacy engagement program that was introduced by the Premier in 2004 to:

 Encourage students to read more books and enjoy reading. Improve literacy levels.

The Challenge requires students to read 12 books between the beginning of the school year and early September.

How to complete the Challenge?

To complete the Premier's Reading Challenge students need to read 12 books between week 1, term 1 and week 7 term 3.

Every student will need a Student Reading Record. This is available from the school's Premier's Reading Challenge coordinator located in the Library.

Read 12 books. Eligible books include e-books, audio books, class/shared reading, prescribed books for school, non-fiction books, books read as research for assignments or books in another language.

1. Reception to Year 6: Students must read 8 books from the

Premier's Reading Challenge booklist and 4 personal choice books.

- 2. Year 7 to Year 9: Students must read 4 books from the Premier's Reading Challenge booklist and 8 personal choice books.
- 3. Year 10 to Year 12: Students must read 12 personal choice books.

Complete the Student Reading Record with the title and author for each book. A parent, guardian, teacher or librarian must sign off on each book to verify it has been read.

Pass on the completed Student Reading Record to the school's Premier's Reading Challenge Coordinator by the designated due date.

Receive an award in late November.

TRY A TRADE

Western Technical College will be running Try-A-Trade courses in Term 2 and Term 3 in 2023. They will be non-accredited courses except for the White Card section, CPCCWHS1001 Prepare to Work Safely in the Construction Industry. The White Card will allow students to also engage in Work Experience within the construction Industry. Students will receive a certificate of participation as evidence of learning.

Once again if numbers permit, we will offer all female classes, mixed classes and all male classes. Western Technical College allows the student to choose whichever class will make them feel more comfortable in their preparation for a VET course in year 11.

Try-A-Trade courses are designed for year 10 students wishing to experience various trades prior to deciding if they will pursue a Flexible Industry Pathway (FIP) in 2024.

Try a Trade Construction courses will be offered based on participant numbers.
