NAME OF CHILD, YEAR LEVEL, REASON FOR ABSENCE *eg If late approximately what time will your child arrive etc.*

A medical certificate is required if a student is away for more than 3 days. For any planned extended absence, a letter to the Principal is required to explain circumstances.

For any planned extended absence, state government legislation requires a parent to send a letter or email to the Principal, via <u>registrar@mcc.catholic.</u> <u>edu.au</u> seeking permission to be absent from school.

In Year 4, the students worked very hard to co construct an Acknowledgement that will be shared with our school community by the Year 4 students.

Wellbeing

Students in Year 4 have started the year by focusing on connection and developing their wellbeing strategies.

Each morning they come into their respective classrooms and chant a

morning mantra, this helps to support those students to start the day off in a positive manner.

This is used as part of our Morning Circle time which is focussed on building connections and taking time to check in that we are ready to start learning each day.

Art

In the establishment weeks students focused on who they are, what their goals were for the year whilst developing a growth mindset.

Within this, students had a lot of fun drawing selfies to represent themselves with apps to show what they like. They were very proud of the results which are hanging in the Year 4 spaces proudly.

STEM

Year 4 have risen to the challenges of STEM this year and look forward to these lessons each week. This has supported the development of teamwork with the focus on communicating with one another, making decisions on design elements, testing their designs, and analysing their success as a team.

Some of the activities they have carried out so far have been creating the tallest freestanding towers using only paper, building a bridge that need to have the ability to hold objects heavier than a kilogram without collapsing and they worked together to see if their team could make the longest paper chain made from just one piece of paper.

Year 9 Geography Wildlife Excursion!

On 26 February the Year 9 Geography class had a wonderful opportunity to visit Cleland National Wildlife Park. The students have been investigating Biomes and Invasive Species, and how we can help prevent further deterioration of our beautiful fauna and flora. Thanks to the brilliant speaker at Cleland, the students were able to learn about the impacts losing our native species can have - such as our wallabies who are intrinsically linked with soil turnover and wildfire control. Throughout the day the students were able to pet various animals, from lizards and snakes to wandering

kangaroos and other native species. After the presentation from the park ranger, the students broke into groups and roamed the park freely, experiencing the beautiful and wonderous sights of our natural landscape. Year 11 Ancient Studies Archaeology Excursion!


