Student Absences/ Late Arrivals

When a student is absent or going to be late, parents should notify the school by 9am on that day by texting the Absentee Line on 0438 368 846 (SMS) or phoning (08) 8447 0500. You will need to state the following:

NAME OF CHILD, YEAR LEVEL, REASON FOR ABSENCE *eg If late approximately what time will your child arrive etc.*

A medical certificate is required if a student is away for more than 3 days. For any planned extended absence, a letter to the Principal is required to explain circumstances.

For any planned extended absence, state government legislation requires a parent to send a letter or email to the Principal, via <u>registrar@mcc.catholic.</u> <u>edu.au</u> seeking permission to be absent from school.

NAPLAN

In 2024, schools and education authorities will receive preliminary school and student results from the assessments early in Term 2, around 4 weeks after the test period ended on 25 March 2024. This is eight weeks earlier than in 2023, a full school term earlier than 2022 and the earliest in the history of NAPLAN. This means teachers will have more time to consider the results alongside their own assessments, and then use them to inform their teaching and learning programs in the current school year.

NAPLAN assessments help governments, education authorities and schools see whether Australian children are reaching important literacy and numeracy goals. NAPLAN also allows parents and guardians to see how their child is progressing against national literacy and numeracy standards. Students can also get an insight into where they are placed on their own individual learning journey.

We look forward to a further analysis of these results when they are released early next term.



On Friday 15 March, a group of Year 7 students travelled to the Odeon Theatre in Norwood to see and experience a live performance of MARROW, performed by The Australian Dance Theatre, part of The Adelaide Arts Festival. It was a unique contemporary dance piece, a work in progress by the company members and new Artistic Director, Daniel Riley. MARROW used contemporary dance technique, smoke, high energy music and unique lighting techniques to explore the current political issues of our land relating to

Indigenous Australians, what the Referendum of 2023 meant for our country and what our hopes are for the future.

On Wednesday this week, our Year 4 Music students attended an African Drumming workshop presented by Simon from Rhythm Culture. The workshop had students learning to play the Djembe, a traditional instrument of West African culture. Students learnt how to produce different sounds and various rhythms and also had a go at some traditional West African singing and dancing. Year 11 Biology Excursion

Stage 1 Biology students attended an excursion to Clinpath Laboratories Mile End across two consecutive Fridays. Students were taken on a tour of the laboratory, in addition to a presentation by senior laboratory technicians and even a pathologist. The pathologist explained how he diagnoses cancer and other diseases, which tied in well with the work the students had been doing in class.

The presentation from the senior lab technician explained the process of receiving a sample to preparing it on a microscope slide for the pathologist, and everything in-between. It was a great opportunity for the students to see some real-world application to their learning, in addition to asking career-related questions to Clinpath staff.


