Artist Spotlight: William Maczkowiack



'Kiosk' and 'Jetty' (Stage 1 Visual Art)

My two pieces are titled Kiosk and Jetty. They are two digital pieces that capture and exaggerate the beauty of a small coastal town on the southern Yorke Peninsula, Port Vincent. These landmarks capture my identity as Port Vincent is a place where my mind becomes empty of everyday stress and is a place where

I can contemplate thoughts in a peaceful state. Hiroshi Yoshida is an artist who influenced the style of Kiosk, and I mimicked his traditional woodblock painting techniques digitally. When I began pursuing art as a hobby I learned from many artists on YouTube and many techniques I learned from them still make appearances in my pieces as their strategies are

naturally embedded in my style. Jetty strayed from this traditional style and took more modern painting techniques but still used colours in the way that Yoshida does. During the creation of these pieces, I learned new techniques and further developed any existing techniques, most notably how to mimic water paint digitally and to paint semi-realistic water.

It was a day of fun, learning, and cultural exchange that our students will remember for a long time. We look forward to more such enriching experiences in the future.

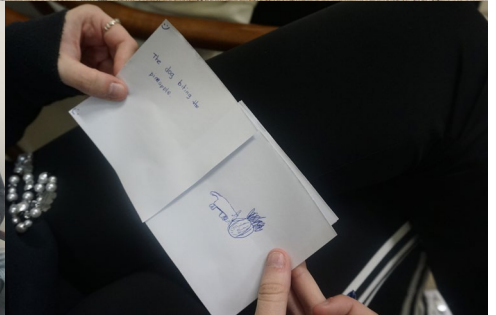
