NAME OF CHILD, YEAR LEVEL, REASON FOR ABSENCE eg If late approximately what time will your child arrive etc.

A medical certificate is required if a student is away for more than 3 days. For any planned extended absence, a letter to the Principal is required to explain circumstances.

BUILDING WORKS IN THE HOLIDAYS

In the December-January holidays we undertook some important building works including:

- Installation of accessibility ramp and stairs to the former Church building on our Primary Campus, as well as replacing the joinery in these classrooms. The rooms have had a wonderful make-over in 2024-2025 and are very inviting spaces to learn.
- The oval area that we have access to has been turned into a sea of green with the grass looking very inviting and the soft fall under the trees has made these spaces accessible for students to play. Unfortunately the playground did not pass a safety test in mid-January 2025 and so we have had to close it to students, as safety must

always come first. We are currently exploring whether we can remove particular pieces of equipment and re-open the playground or whether we should replace all of the playground equipment. We will give you an update when we have further news.

- The new building on the Primary Campus is progressing well and we are still hopeful of moving into this building at the start of Term 3.
- On the Secondary Campus, startup works included removal of powerlines and now the lift shaft is in place.

JUBILEE YEAR: PILGRIMS OF HOPE

Our Opening Mass for both campuses centred around the Jubilee year theme, Pilgrims of Hope. Fr Jack led students in our Eucharistic celebrations as students brought their own hopes for the year to the Mass.

Student Supervision

As a school we have what the law defines as a duty of care towards the students enrolled. While the courts recognise that accidents cannot be totally prevented, schools are charged with the responsibility of ensuring the type of supervision which a normal parent would provide, considering the age of the student and the activity in which they are engaged. I would like to remind parents and students about several points which arise from the school's duty of care:

- Students will be supervised within the school grounds each school day from 8:05am on the secondary campus and 8:30 am on the primary campus.
- 2. Students are supervised at recess and lunch times.

- When dismissed in the afternoon, students are expected to leave the school grounds immediately and proceed directly home. Students staying for activities organised by the school, such as sport or drama practice, will be supervised.
- 4. If a student is late or absent it is the responsibility of Parents/
 Caregivers to notify the College before 9:00am. To do this, a text message can be sent to 0438 368 846 and include student name, Pastoral Care Group/Primary Teacher, reason for lateness/ absence and the date. This number is only available for text messaging. If the College has not

been notified of an absence or late arrival by 9:00 am, an SMS text message will be sent to Parents/Caregivers that morning, advising them that the student is not at school. It is the responsibility of a Parent/Guardian to provide current and updated mobile numbers to the College to ensure this process is maintained.

These measures ensure that both parents and staff are able to exercise their legal responsibilities for the students in a way that ensures a responsible degree of safety.

SCHOOL FEE STATEMENTS

Thank you to all those families who have contacted us to arrange payment plans, School Card Applications and Catholic Primary Sibling Discount forms, it is appreciated.

Statements will be issued within 2 weeks, and I thank you for your patience and understanding whilst we work towards finalizing them. When you receive your statement, please check that all information is correct and please refer to our 2025 Fee Schedule on our website for further detailed information which may have relevance to your family. Any anomalies noticed on your statement, please contact us as soon as possible so it can be addressed.

PAYMENT PLANS

It is your responsibility to arrange a payment plan to ensure your school fees account is paid by 30 November each year as per our Fees Policy. This involves reviewing your payment plan regularly. We are available to assist you with this process at any time. If you have any concerns about meeting your fee commitment, please contact us as soon as possible as it is important to us that we apply an appropriate plan and support to individuals who are experiencing any challenges. Please be assured that all discussions remain confidential.

New Payment plans need to be completed and lodged with us annually unless it has no end date. *They are not automatically renewed.*

SCHOOL CARD

To receive Tier 2 Fees at the beginning of each year you will need to complete a School Card Application relevant to your circumstances. They are available for online lodgement (our preference) or lodge with the College a hard-copy as soon as possible. Anyone who was eligible last year and new families commencing this year who provided us with a copy of their Centrelink card with their Acceptance of Offer payment will automatically have Tier 2 fees applied.

If you are advised that you are not eligible for School Card and do not agree with their Assessment of your application, please complete a Reassessment Form providing supporting documentation and lodge either to with the College or School Card Department within the timeframe requested.

School Card discounts will be reversed (if applied) on your account upon notification you are not eligible based on the following:

- Reassessment Form not lodged within the timeframe requested.
- No further action taken by you regarding not eligible status.
- You confirmed with the College that you are not eligible.

Please contact us if you have any questions or concerns to do with School Card, application process including Reassessment as we can guide you to what options are available to you based on your current circumstances.

QKR

This payment method is an App that is installed onto your phone. You can also access QKR on your laptop, tablet, or PC (instructions are available on our website). We are continually extending what is paid by QKR as it provides flexibility of lodging payments outside business hours.

NAPLAN - privacy collection notice

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) takes place each year for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 and has been an everyday part of the school calendar since 2008.

NAPLAN helps parents, carers and educators to see if children are meeting important numeracy and literacy standards.

Collection of personal information

Schools are required by law to collect personal information about you and your child, irrespective of whether your child participates in NAPLAN testing.

The purpose of this notice is to advise parents and carers of how personal information about you and your child will be used for NAPLAN testing (both online and paper tests) and NAPLAN readiness activities scheduled at various times leading up to the test in March 2025.

NAPLAN testing

Since 2022 NAPLAN tests are completed nationally online, except for Year 3 writing which remains paper-based and a small number of students who will continue to use alternative format (paper or electronic pdf tests).

Online testing brings many benefits and opportunities including providing better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information.

Readiness testing activities

A critical step in preparing for NAPLAN is schools' participation in readiness testing activities.

The purpose of readiness testing activities is to ensure your child is familiar with their device and the online test environment, as well as to confirm school infrastructure systems and processes are in place for NAPLAN testing.

Disclosure of personal information

For every student participating in NAPLAN testing and readiness activities, personal information will be uploaded by the Department for Education, as the Test Administration Authority (TAA), to the NAPLAN Online Assessment Platform ('assessment platform'). For information on how ACARA collects and uses personal information about you and your child for NAPLAN please refer to <u>ACARA's privacy notices</u>.

The information overleaf marked with an asterisk (*) is also provided by the department, as the TAA, to FUJIFILM Data Management Solutions Pty Ltd for the purposes of printing paper test materials and the printing of student reports. FUJIFILM Data Management Solutions Pty Ltd ("FUJIFILM") is subject to rigorous information privacy and data security obligations under its contract with the Department for Education and is only permitted access to personal information from a relevant school for the purposes of providing the contracted services.
